## Conflict Incident Monthly Tracker

## Ondo State: July-August 2017

### Background

This monthly tracker is designed to update Peace Agents on patterns and trends in conflict risk and violence, as identified by the Integrated Peace and Development Unit (IPDU) early warning system, and to seek feedback and input for response to mitigate areas of conflict.

## Patterns and Trends May-July 2017

According to Peace Map data (see Figure 1), there was an increase in lethal violence in the state in July. Incidents reported during the period included criminality, cult violence, militancy, and communal tensions.

Violent Criminality: In June, a chieftain of the All Progressive Congress (APC) was reportedly kidnapped and later found dead in Ese-Odo LGA. In July, three kidnappers were reportedly killed and several others injured during a police operation to rescue abducted school children in Ile-Oluji/Okeigbo LGA. Separately, robbers reportedly attacked a bullion van and injured some policemen and bank officials in Ondo East LGA. In another incident, gunmen reportedly killed a 50-year old man and stole his motorcycle in Akure South. In Okitipupa LGA, a 24-year old woman was reportedly killed by unknown persons at a farm.

<u>Cult Violence</u>: In June, ten were reportedly killed and several others injured during a supremacy battle between rival cult groups in Akure South LGA. In July, two were reportedly killed in separate clashes between Eiye and Aiye confraternities in Akure South.

<u>Communal Tensions</u>: In June, herdsmen reportedly clashed with police at the farm of the former Secretary to the Government of the Federation (SGF) in Akure North LGA, and killed a 64-year old farmer. In July, a man was reportedly killed by hoodlums over a kingship tussle in Akoko North-West LGA.

Others: In July, five college students were reportedly arrested by the police for raping an 18-year old female student of the institution. Separately, fifteen were reportedly injured during a clash between factions of the Ondo State chapter of the National Union of Road Transport Workers

(NURTW) in Akure South LGA.

# Recent Incidents or Issues, August 2017

Incidents during the month related mainly to criminality and communal tensions.

Communal Tensions: Herders reportedly attacked a farm in Odigbo LGA and killed a farmer who confronted them. Separately, herders reportedly killed four farmers and destroyed crops in Akure South. The incident sparked off a protest by villagers. In another incident, herdsmen reportedly raped a 72-year old woman in her farm in Odigbo LGA.

<u>Criminality</u>: Gunmen reportedly abducted four passengers who were travelling on a commercial bus and shot dead another in

Akoko North East LGA. Separately, robbers reportedly killed a pastor and stole his motorcycle in Okitipupa. In another incident, a policeman reportedly shot dead his superior during an argument and thereafter committed suicide in Odigbo LGA. In Ondo West, two female students of a collage were reportedly kidnapped and killed for ritualistic purposes.

**Protest:** During the month, commercial motorcyclists in the state protested a police order that prohibits them from carrying more than a passenger at a time. The protesters also called for the release of their colleagues arrested over the police order.

#### **Prognosis**

Reported incidents in the State during this period related mainly to criminality, cult violence, communal tensions, and Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG). Peace Agents must monitor the situation closely and respond appropriately.

- 3. What are some likely trigger events in the next 6 months that could escalate this conflict?

- 5. What will you do to help mitigate the conflict in the short, medium, and long term?






Figure 3: Conflict Fatalities by LGA
