

YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS (YEP) Project

Terms of Reference – Engagement of a Consultant to support the implementation of the YEP Project

BACKGROUND

PIND is a Nigerian non-profit Foundation established in 2010 to support a portfolio of socio-economic development programs in Niger Delta in order to improve standards of living of communities in the region. PIND supports projects in collaboration with a diverse range of donor partners including bilateral and multi-lateral aid agencies, federal and state government agencies in Nigeria, private companies, and foundations. With an overarching goal of increasing income and employment in the region, PIND's strategy is hinged on 2 main programs supported by 3 key enablers and these are:

- **Economic Development**: Facilitate inclusive, sustainable, and diversified economic growth enabled by improved analysis, advocacy, and capacity building of market actors.
- **Peace Building**: Strengthen conflict management systems and capacities for enabling peace & economic growth, utilizing analysis & advocacy to address constraints to peace.
- **Enablers**: PIND's program delivery is enabled by an integrated approach that encompasses capacity building, advocacy, communications, gender and social inclusion.

In response to the challenge posed by the very high rates of unemployment or underemployment in the Niger Delta, particularly amongst the youth population, PIND, with funding support from the Ford Foundation, started implementing the Niger Delta Youth Employment Pathways (NDYEP) Project in the last quarter of 2017. The project maps the ecosystem of skills development, analyzes opportunities for employment creation, and develops models of youth job readiness or workforce development that provide disadvantaged young men and women in the Niger Delta with the opportunity to secure sustainable jobs and enterprises. The project approach involves innovative and quality training that prepares selected youth with market-relevant skills and supports their transition into waged employment or self-employment/entrepreneurship.

The pilot phase of NDYEP was implemented over two years, from 2018 to 2020, in Abia, Akwa Ibom, and Rivers States and was scaled up to Delta State in 2021 and launched in Ondo State in 2024. So far, the program has trained over 9,000 youths in various skills, with about 63% of them making immediate transitions to waged employment or self-entrepreneurship. The target sectors are Integrated Agriculture with a focus on aquaculture, Information and Communication Technology (ICT), Building Construction, and Services, including finished leather and renewable energy.

PIND Foundation is seeking to engage a Consultant to support the YEP Project team in the implementation of its project activities.

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PURPOSE OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The selected consultant will support the team in carrying out scheduled activities, including stakeholder engagements, ecosystem strengthening design and implementation of various interventions, grantmaking and grantees supervision, work planning and reporting, and government engagement for the adoption of the NDYEP model and framework.

OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The specific objectives of the assignment are as follows:

Advance the project's work effectively by coordinating the activities of implementing partners. This will include working with partners and other agencies to document technical and soft skills training activities, updating on post-training follow-up and support to youth participants, and supporting efforts to build linkages with private sector companies to identify opportunities for job placements and retention of youth in employment or through entrepreneurship.

Work with YEP Project Management and other PIND Units to support the engagement of governments in both project and non-project states, coordinating technical assistance and exchange programs to facilitate NDYEP model adoption.

Provide project management support as indicated in the scope of work below.

SCOPE OF WORK & SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES

The selected consultant will assist the YEP Project Manager and PIND Management in the implementation of all technical aspects of the project, including reporting on the project.

Specific Activities include but are not limited to:

- a. Coordination and monitoring of the implementation of YEP activities in project states.
- b. Engagement with public and private sector stakeholders through targeted meetings and dissemination events to share and dialogue about action research findings, implementation of outcomes, and lessons.
- Focus on building/strengthening the ecosystem of stakeholders, building linkages with private sector entities to identify opportunities for jobs for youth or specific business opportunities in the supply chain of the organizations or value chain of any of the focus sectors.
- d. Contribute to research design, supervision, and review of research outputs in coordination with the program management and other team members.
- e. Expand public and private sector engagement and dialogue leading to internships, employment, business opportunities for start-up enterprises, and uptake of program findings.
- f. Participate in Monitoring and evaluation of Youth Skills for Employment program approaches and activities (including sub-grantees); analysis and dissemination of findings.
- Identification and enlistment of private sector employer partners.

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FOUNDATION FOR PARTNERSHIP INITIATIVES IN THE NIGER DELTA

- h. Data collection and analysis for progress reporting on a quarterly basis.
- i. Contribute to preparation of reports as required by the Youth Employment Pathways Project and Economic Development.
- j. Other duties that may be assigned by the Manager or PIND management.

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DURATION & LOCATION OF WORK

The Consultant will be engaged from September 2024 to December 2024 and the contract will be subject to renewal depending on satisfactory performance.

The activity will be carried out in Abia, Akwa Ibom, Rivers, Delta, and Ondo states primarily, but will also extend to all 9 Niger Delta States. The Consultant will work from either PIND's Warri office, with regular travel within the Niger Delta.

QUALIFICATION

The consultant should hold a University Degree in a Social Science or Science background, with good knowledge of project management, commendable writing skills, and sound knowledge of Microsoft Excel, PowerPoint, Data Analysis, and Data Visualization.

He/she should have at least 3 years of work experience and be very familiar with working in the Niger Delta region.
