Innovative Solutions to the Niger Delta's Development Challenges

For many years, conflict ravaged Nigeria's Niger Delta, slowed down development and escalated poverty in the region. In 2010, Chevron Corporation set up the Foundation for Partnership Initiatives in the Niger Delta (PIND) to rally cross-sector partnerships to foster stability and inclusive economic development in the region.

After ten years of programming, we conducted a Participatory Stakeholders Review to get feedback on our work and insights on our future direction. Feedback from key stakeholders (donors, governments, investors, civil society, thought leaders, and local communities) indicated that:

Generally, PIND's approaches are recognized as unique and effective and have spurred peaceable economic growth and development in the Niger Delta. They adjudged that these approaches have established us as a reputable trusted partner and thought-leader in peace and economic development in the Niger Delta.

In this calendar, we highlight a few examples of some specific constraints to development in the region that we met when we started operations in 2010, and share excerpts of the proven and recognized innovative approaches that we are applying to solve them. Such examples include evidence-based interventions, resilient markets for the poor, social capital for peace, business-efficient technologies, financing for small businesses, safe water social entrepreneurs for underserved communities, energy-efficient builders, capabilities for service delivery and connection platforms for development.

Data for Informed Program Investments

Data drives good decision-making. Before 2010, there was a shortage of data to guide development investments in the agriculture sector in the Niger Delta. Since then, PIND has analyzed the region's aquaculture, cassava, palm oil, cocoa and fish feed value chains. Such data has informed the agricultural program interventions of PIND and its development partners such as the UK Department for International Development (DFID) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in the region.

A Network Approach to Social Capital for Peace

Lack of a voice, a structured platform for collective action and poor conflict management skills limits individuals from promoting peace. PIND established the Partners for Peace (P4P) Network as a platform for peace actors to amplify their voices, build capacities and collectively engage in conflict mitigation and reduction in the Niger Delta. With over 7,000 members spread across the nine states of the Niger Delta, PIND's P4P is currently the largest network of peace actors in Nigeria. These peace agents have mitigated and prevented over hundreds of conflicts in the region.

Boosting CSOs/BMOs Capacity to Engender Development

The service delivery and civic engagement of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and Business Membership Organizations (BMOs) are the thresholds of social and economic progress. But, back in 2011, stakeholder consultations showed CSOs and BMOs in the Niger Delta had weak capacities to play this role effectively and lagged behind counterparts in other regions of the country. PIND's Capacity Building for Local Empowerment (CAPABLE) project has enhanced the institutional capabilities of over 180 CSOs/BMOs to network, access funds and partner with local and international organizations to engender development in the region.


Long Term Development Plans for Economic Growth

Many State Governments in the Niger Delta have the will to drive development but are sometimes, constrained by a weak capacity to produce them. Long term planning provides a framework for sustained economic growth. PIND supported the Cross River State Government to create a 30-year Growth & Development Strategy, with similar support being provided to the governments of Abia and Edo States to develop their long-term plans.

Access to Safe Water for Underserved Communities

Access to safe drinking water is mostly lacking in hard to reach communities in the Niger Delta – leading to a high disease burden. Commercializing clean water for sale at affordable prices to poor households will make it more available to them. PIND, in partnership with UNICEF and other water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) oriented organizations, has trained over 100 social entrepreneurs to provide cost-friendly safe water to these underserved communities

Financing for Small Businesses

Most times, small businesses fail or stagnate due to the lack of capital that they require to sustain or scale their operations. PIND has been facilitating access to finance for the region's SMEs. For example, through funds from PIND's Technology Adoption Grant, millers in the Niger Delta procured more efficient palm oil processing mills. The mills are helping them to produce and sell better quality oil at higher prices — with bigger profits. PIND recently established Sombreiro Kapital, a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) that is set to provide alternative sources of investment and working capital for market actors in the region.

Making Markets Work for The Poor



Early Warning and Early Response Data for Peacebuilding

Peacebuilding is a collective responsibility requiring multiple players, men and women, old and young, at all levels. Access to data can inform better peacebuilding action. PIND's SMS-based Early Warning and Early Response (EWER) infrastructure collects and analyses local conflict intelligence data from across the region. The EWER works in tandem with PIND's peace map (www.p4p-nigerdelta.org) that aggregates conflict data from various credible sources. This data is available to all peace actors to use to identify and respond to conflict within their milieu.

Appropriate Technologies for Better Economic and Social Outcomes

Appropriate technologies (ATs) are readily available, low-cost and easy to use by local communities and small businesses to meet their basic human or business needs. PIND's Appropriate Technology Enabled Development (ATED) project pilots and shares AT solutions to improve business efficiencies, mitigate climate change and reduce the cost of energy in the Niger Delta. Examples of ATs promoted by PIND include energy cabins, palm oil harvesting and processing technologies, fish smoking technologies, cassava processing technologies, WASH-based technologies and hand-press brick-making technologies.

Online Platform for Development Discourse and Advocacy

To address the complex development challenges of the Niger Delta requires access to data, collaboration, coordination and connections among stakeholder groups. PIND's NDLink serves as a one-stop online shop where stakeholders connect, collaborate and share information on crucial Niger Delta issues and developments. NDLink has over 3,500 registered members, 100 organizational memberships, over 500 published projects and has had over 13 million visits since 2015. The platform hosted 19 development-oriented discussions in 2018 alone and has announced over 240 job openings
