
Niger Delta Weekly Conflict Update




Anticipated Trends and Dynamics


The ongoing surge in criminal violence and targeted killings could escalate further, significantly affecting conflict dynamics and intensifying social, political, economic, and security challenges in the state. If left unchecked, this could lead to a breakdown of law and order.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Security agencies have intensified operations to combat criminal activities through targeted raids and the rescue of kidnapped victims. Additionally, community leaders and local authorities are working closely with law enforcement to help mitigate the situation.
