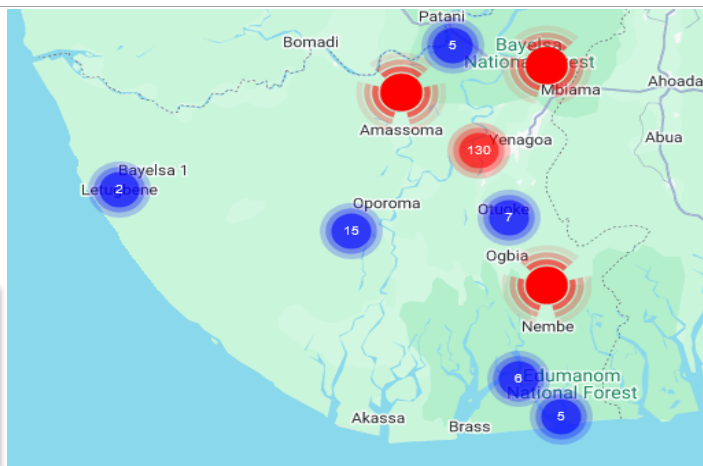
Preventing the Resurgence of Cult and Gang Related Violence in Bayelsa State

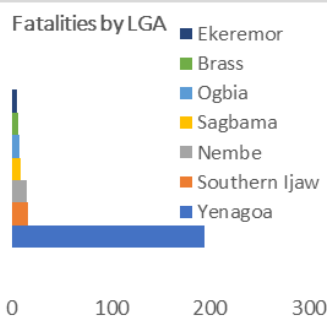
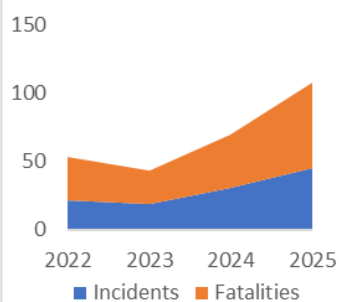

Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

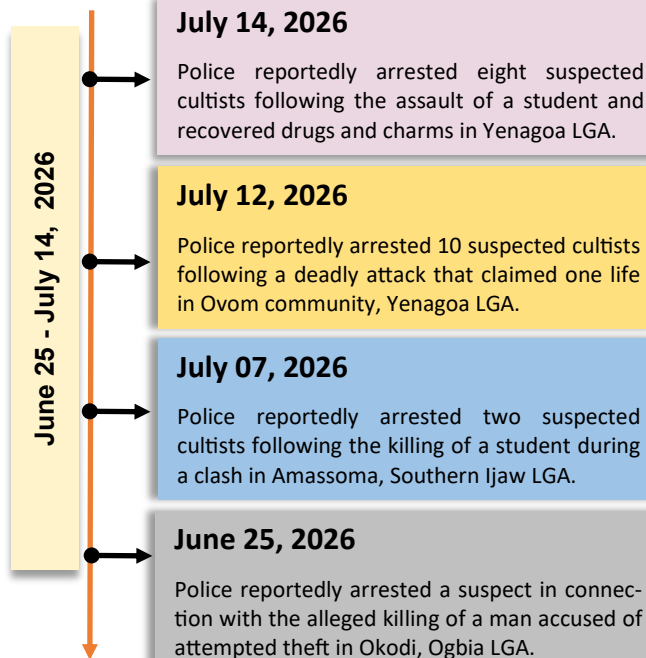
The resurgence of cult and gang-related violence could intensify insecurity and trigger retaliatory attacks. Without timely early warning and coordinated security responses, violence may disrupt socio-economic activities and erode public trust in security institutions.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Security agencies have intensified intelligence-led operations and arrests to curb cult and gang violence. However, sustained early warning, community engagement, and coordinated law enforcement efforts remain critical to preventing the resurgence of violence.
